A virtual meeting of Steventon Parish Council was held on Tuesday 1st December 2020 at 7pm

1. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Apologies had been received from Mr M Tucker and Cllr M Barber (VWH)

2. PRESENT

Dr C Wilding, Chair, Mr J Bennett, Mrs C Brickwood, Mr J Clark, Mr R Green, Mr J Rice, and Mr M Stimpson-Tame. Mrs A Einon (Parish Clerk) and Cllr Mike Fox-Davies (OCC), were in attendance. The meeting was joined by six members of the public.

3. DECLARATIONS OF PECUNIARY INTERESTS AND OTHER DECLARATIONS

To receive any declarations of disclosable pecuniary interests, and other declarations, in respect of items on the agenda for this meeting.

There were no declarations.

4. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

4.1. Lorries in High Street

The excessive number of HGV's in High Street is causing damage to property and the roads. Excessive speeds particularly at night disturbs the residents. The problem is caused by the access to Steventon Storage facility, the number of lorries is far in excess to the amount involved when it was set up. Mike Fox-Davies has been trying to get an agreement with the users of the facility but so far without success. Changes to the operating licences would be required or a weight limit on the road. Cllr Mike Fox-Davies asked for everyone inconvenienced by the traffic to write to him explaining the problems. He would collate and submit to OCC and the Vale, with a view to getting the road resurfaced and possible speed restriction.

Dr Wilding would distribute a leaflet around High Street and Hanney Road to encourage residents to write into Mike Fox-Davies.

Install the traffic monitor in High Street to record speeds, with no lights showing, in June 2018 the average speed was 27mph, it would be useful data.

Police traffic speed monitor, Drayton seems to have frequent presence, but they are not seen in Steventon.

A group called 20's Plenty for Oxfordshire has been formed to get villages together to support a 20 mph limit. Steventon had lodged its support.

4.2. Emergency Services

An ambulance waited at the level crossing for 18 minutes. Crew did not know what to do they were not aware of the alternative route nor had they rung the number on the crossing for information. Robert Green still organizing a meeting with the Chief Fire Officer, the Chief of Police, the Ambulance coordinator, with Network Rail, to standardize protocols that all use and are aware of the likely problems. Robert Green requires details of any incidents to send to all so they can examine their records. Yet again nothing has been done. Since the fire at the copse the Fire officer has brought representatives for training from Abingdon and Didcot stations to see the level crossings and the alternative route.

5. REPORT FROM ANY COUNTY OR DISTRICT COUNCILLOR IN ATTENDANCE

Cllr Mike Fox-Davies reported:

Changes to Covd-19 regulations going into tier 2 from 2nd December. Some leeway over Christmas. A winter hardship grant is available. The County has been successful in obtaining tranche 2 money from the

government 2.98 million for cycling upgrade. Unfortunately, not for rural parishes but for Bicester, Witney, Oxford.

People issued with healthcare support, like wheelchairs, crutches, etc are requested to return as the NHS is short of supply,

Traffic problems around the School has become even worse in that parked cars are all everywhere, A recent incident when a child was nearly knocked over at the blind junction of the Causeway and the road that accesses Brind Close. There are few actual pavements in the area which means that children are in the road amongst the cars. Mike Fox-Davies agreed to get someone to come and observe the problem with a view to increasing signage and parking restrictions. Mr Mottram the headteacher is genuinely concerned about the dangers.

Steventon Hill water, Mike Fox-Davies has chased but Thames Water have denied ownership again. Highways are having to prove that the water is sourced from Thames Water.

12.1.1. P20/V2833/HH 54 Hanney Road Steventon Abingdon OX13 6AL

First and second floor extensions to convert bungalow to two storey dwelling with additional rooms in the roof. Single storey rear extension. Single storey front extensions.

Object. Over development, insufficient parking, little detail, composite drawing with no measurements or design and access statement. The building would dominate the access to the village and the surrounding bungalows. A three storey six bedroomed building in this location does not fit.

Minor modifications to previously approved P18/V2058/HH and P18/V2059/LB
