1. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Apologies had been received from Mr J Bennett, Mr R Green and Cllr M Barber

4. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

4.1. LITTER

Sally Povolotsky with Gavin Attard proposed a litter pick on 22nd December, they will get the necessary equipment from the Vale. Come and join in.

4.4. Traffic volume

Detailed analysis of the tube recording was still awaited as the OCC analysis person has been off with Covid. However initial examination of the consolidated 5 day results showed that on average between the hours of 8pm and 6 am in High Street there were 122 LGV's and 33 HGV's on the Hanney Road, 40 LGV's and 10 HGV's. Between the hours of 6 am and 8 pm. High Street had 1520 LGV's and 570 HGV's. Hanney Road 630 LGV's and 410 HGV's. The posts for the speed monitors had been installed and it was hoped that the monitors would be in place in the next few weeks. A very helpful response from Mark Frances to the Clerk explaining the costs and procedures for double yellow lines, parking restrictions and speed variations would be acted upon. The Parish Council would like to implement as many as possible and it will be discussed at the Infrastructure meeting on 14th December..

4.5. **GARD**

Derek Stork reported that GARD's AGM had been well supported. Water resources south-east consultation is open from 17th January to 14th March as many people as possible please comment. GARD would be putting in a report. VOWHDC were motion tomorrow to challenge Thames Water on the lack of costs, details regarding flooding and other problems.

Consultation

Residents can have their say on our budget proposals, including our proposed council tax level for 2022/23 and the strategic priorities by visiting letstalk.oxfordshire.gov.uk/budgetconsultation and completing the online survey. The survey opened on 2 December and closes on 5 January 2022. The outcomes of this budget consultation will be considered by the Cabinet on 18 January 2022. Once Full Council had considered it on the 8 February 2022, we will plan any specific service changes that we need to work within our budget. Consultation feedback will also help develop a new strategic plan for the council.

Protecting Oxfordshire's vulnerable adults

To mark National Safeguarding Adults Week recently, we wanted to showcase the instrumental role our adults safeguarding team plays in ensuring the safety of some of Oxfordshire's most vulnerable residents.

Drive to curb scams by dodgy builders in Oxfordshire

Residents are being warned by our trading standards colleagues to be wary of leaflets offering driveway or roofing repairs after some property owners were charged for additional, unnecessary work. A separate risk involves private contractors cold calling to offer work to lower highway kerbs that allows vehicles to access properties

Routine roadworks to be halted during seasonal period

Planned routine roadwork schemes on dozens of Oxfordshire roads will be halted over the festive period to help communities, shoppers, and businesses. We are bringing in the seasonal initiative on certain roads from 5pm on Friday 3 December until Tuesday 4 January. Emergency roadworks will still be permitted, but only when necessary.

I am delighted to bring you news of two appointments.

Dr Adam Briggs, Deputy Director of Public Health Dr James Kent, Chief Executive Designate (BOB ICB)

Update you on a new scheme to help residents with festive food waste by **offering free food caddy liners at our libraries** and how you can get **crafty at The Oxfordshire Museum**. We also share two progress developments related to **A40 improvements**.

I also had a workshop this past week on Rowstock Relief project proposals and have invited the lead designer to either pop down or I'll be creating a video showing the pinch points. The SID data from Harwell and Hendreds has been most helpful in decision making and has led to a few changes and revisions of options. As an officer on the call mentioned something has been in discussion and needed for the last 15yrs, so it's about time we got on with the job in hand. I expect public consultation to be March April although foresee a few delays based on current Covid changes.

I have an emergency meeting next week around Steventon Bridge with officers and contractors to talk through the issues found, there is further work there from Monday and access will be manned from 9.30am – 3.30pm and will allow school buses, cyclists and pedestrians through during those permit times.

I also attended the Guardians meeting as a member that now sits on our children in care panel, it was great to hear how much work is being done, as a child I was in the care services and as a teenager and wow so much has changed now which is fantastic to hear and see.

Steventon back in the centre again this time at the Vale of White Horse Full Council, I spoke in support of the anti-reservoir position on a motion put forwards to strengthen local support against the ridiculous idea! Thanks to SPC and GARD for their sterling contribution again too!

10.4.1 Play area

The quote from Playground solutions to continue quarterly maintenance on the St Michael's Play area was discussed and agreed. The Clerk had asked them to quote for the repair of the fence around the MUGA and/or possible replacement as it seems to have increased problems. The basket seat was due to be reinstalled, there had been a trailing wire on the zip which had been refixed. Mr Brew had accessed the bearings and swivels on the swings and found some wear and one bolt of the wrong size. The Clerk had asked him to order and replace the necessary parts.

10.4.2 Grass cutting, wilding biodiversity MST,JC, Dawn Clements(Sarinc),Clerk

Sarinc had ask for a schedule for the grass cutting Mr Stimpson-Tame agreed to provide this.

The posts for the speed monitors are now ready, Mr D Green from East Hanney had been very helpful in sharing his knowledge. The recommended fixing bands have been ordered but will not be delivered until Christmas, it was felt that an initial sign could be installed with the weaker bands already obtained. Initially the one by Field Gardens where there was more room to manoeuvre. A reconditioned tablet had been purchased, from the Chairman's allowance, to download the information easily.
