

Parish Council Report

The Parish Council met on Tuesday 6th December. There were 5 Parish Councillors and several members of the public present. Sally Povolotsky, our County and District Councillor, had sent her apologies, as she was attending a Vale of White Horse District Council meeting.

During public participation we heard from Nick Thompson, who updated everyone on the latest information from GARD concerning their recent public meetings and the ongoing campaign to raise awareness about the issues around the reservoir proposal. Nick also thanked everybody for their support for the Royal British Legion collections and events during November. The Armistice Day wreath laying had been very well attended and poppy sellers had collected over £5000. The Parish Council thanked him for all his hard work in organising the collections again this year.

Anti-social behaviour and lack of community policing was also discussed, following a recent fly-tipping incident on the village green. Councillor Broadbent had attended a recent public police meeting in Wantage and raised the subject of lack of police visibility with our local police inspector. Police recruitment figures have improved recently and, once PCSO numbers are back up to strength, it was hoped that community policing would become more visible in the near future.

Councillors went on to discuss issues around damage to some of the Parish Council-owned grass spaces and verges around the village, mainly from parking and vehicle manoeuvres. The verges are particularly soft after all the recent rain, and some deep muddy ruts have appeared. Some of these areas had only recently been cleared and re-seeded.

The S106 Arts working group had met recently and reported back to the other Councillors. This group had been formed a number of years ago to develop some public art projects for the village, using money from the developers of the new estates. The decision had been made to develop a series

of hand-carved benches, to place at various locations around the village, all with some link to the local history. This is now in the final stages, with designs now agreed. There are some beautiful designs by local wood carver Peter Greenfield, incorporating ideas from local groups (History group, DAMASCUS youth group) as well as other villagers. We would hope to see the first tranche of these benches being installed late Spring 2023.

The first ditching clearance of the winter took place in November and mainly focused on the ditches around the Green. There will be another ditching party clearance in January. Please contact Martin Stimpson-Tame if you are able to help, at:

The recent torrential rain showed how important it is to keep the ditches clear if we are to avoid any serious flooding in the village.



There's a time for everything and a season for every activity

'Well Philip, you are faced with a stark choice and your decision will profoundly influence your future wellbeing!' A sobering message delivered just before Christmas – from a bank manager, bishop, or even higher? Has the vicar been to see a Fortune Teller? None of these. This message was delivered by my physiotherapist and followed up with: 'at your age do have time for both rest and vigorous exercise with no valid excuses for avoiding both!'

There is a time for everything is the title of a section of the Hebrew wisdom literature, in which the anonymous writer poses an important question, 'what do we gain from our labours?' Then proceeds to answer their question with: 'I know that there is nothing better for people than to be happy and to do good while they live. That each of them may eat and drink and find satisfaction in all their toil—this is the gift of God. I know that everything God does will endure forever; nothing can be added to it, and nothing taken from it'.

Facing 2023 with all its gloomy forecasts, a piece of ancient Hebrew literature has some very contemporary advice and encouragement – finding satisfaction in our labours is a gift from God, because His nature is to enable our endeavours to achieve lasting (eternal) benefits. 



Roots and Shoots Steventon has been formed by a group of village volunteers, as a way of supporting our local community in these difficult times. We are entirely funded through donations and grants and run as a 'not-for-profit' organisation. 100% of the donations and funds raised will be reinvested into our three core projects:

- Community Kitchen
- Warm Space Café
- Community Allotment.

We have already received grants from Steventon Parish Council and Oxfordshire County Council, with further funding applied for from the Vale of White Horse District Council, and with invaluable support from SARINC, who have provided two sites for our Community Allotment.

The 'Warm Space Café' has been running since early October in the Church Hall, welcoming around 50 people each time, but with plenty of space for more! We provide a lovely warm environment for meeting up with friends; the opportunity for some lively conversation; a play space with toys for our younger visitors and their mums – with everyone enjoying our delicious home-made soups, cakes, teas and coffees – and sometimes we even have bacon butties! We don't expect payment for any food or drinks, but any donations are obviously most welcome. In the New Year, the café will be running every Tuesday from 3rd January and will be open from 9am until around 2pm, through the winter months and continuing throughout the year. Please don't forget the birds!



Many of your kitchen scraps and Christmas leftovers make ideal snacks for birds visiting your garden and can help them get the food they need to survive. Here's a quick guide from the RSPB to what you can put out:

Roast potatoes - cold and opened up, these will be eaten by most garden birds.

Vegetables - cold Brussels, parsnips or carrots will be eaten by starlings and other birds, but remember not to put out more than will be eaten in one day. Pastry - cooked or uncooked is excellent, especially if it has been made with real fats. Cheese - Hard bits of cheese are a favourite with robins, blackbirds and

song thrushes.. Avoid feeding them very strong or blue cheeses. *Dried fruits* - raisins, sultanas and currants are particularly enjoyed by blackbirds, song thrushes and robins. *Biscuits and cake* - Stale cake and broken pieces of biscuits from the bottom of the tin are high in fat and ideal for birds in the winter.

Don't forget to put out water too or break the ice on ponds and puddles.

Golden rules for feeding birds

Don't put out salty foods. Birds can't digest salt and it will damage their nervous systems. Only leave enough that can be eaten in one day – otherwise you may attract unwanted visitors, such as mice and rats.

Always follow sensible hygiene measures, including washing hands thoroughly after filling and washing feeders.
