Minutes of a meeting of the Planning Committee of Steventon Parish Council held on Tuesday 21st February 2023 starting at 7 p.m., **in St. Michael's School Hall**

1. Apologies for Absence

5. Planning Applications

5.1. <u>P23/V0267/N4C</u> Manor Farm Church Lane Steventon OX13 6SN Change of use from agricultural to flexible use including B8. No objection but request a limitation on traffic movements, as specified in the application, and a maximum weight limit of 7.5 ton. Access via Church Lane only.

5.2. <u>P23/V0165/FUL</u> Land to the rear of 31 The Causeway Steventon Abingdon OX13 6SE New build 3 bedroom house with associated parking and amenity space. Steventon Parish Council object to the building. The access is too narrow and dangerous to serve the houses already permitted. The cottage to the left of the access way is listed and has no foundations the attached photo illustrates the width of access and danger to the building. Delivery of this equipment closed the road for a good 15 minutes at peak travel time. The access is long and single width, no passing places, access from the Causeway will block the road while waiting for a clear run. In the event that the building is approved it is essential that a strict code of traffic management and work schedules be imposed to minimise the effect on immediate neighbours.
