Steventon Speedwatch Group has been running for nearly a year now. We've received a huge amount of support from local residents which we really appreciate. Our team has grown to 13 members and we now have additional sites around the village. We all give about an hour a week of our time on a voluntary basis to monitor the traffic. Since July last year, between us, we have spent circa 100 hours doing our speedwatch sessions and recorded over 1100 speeding motorists with a top speed recorded of 59mph. Of these vehicles, approximately 5% were without MOT or Tax and the police have

I could do with a holiday this summer

June, the start of our meteorological summer, when our hopes turn to restful warm sunny days in the garden or perhaps going on holiday. Looking forward to a much needed break from the gloom of the crises and threats which surround us, or the gloom of the weather and our tiredness.

Pentecost heralds the start of summer – the time when the church remembers and gives thanks for God's gift of His life giving, life enhancing, Spirit. To the early church, God sent His Holy Spirit to be their strength in times of human weakness and vulnerability. As our energy, faith and hope diminishes, Pentecost reminds us again that God's strength is made perfect in our weakness.

Pentecost makes me realise that our sense of emptiness is not a negative thing, it is a capacity. We read on containers the capacity they hold. Capacities are there to be filled. Without the Holy Spirit we are nothing. It is only through the Holy Spirit, God within us, that we come to believe in God's refreshing love. It is only through the Holy Spirit that we can pray at all; for true prayer is always the Holy Spirit praying in and through us. It is only through the Holy Spirit that we are capable of any genuine good, for that which is of God within us is good. Without the Holy Spirit we are an emptiness. But this emptiness is a capacity waiting to be filled.

W.J.Carey, Bishop of Bloemfontein from 1921-1934, wrote a prayer which he suggested should be 'prayed slowly; or brooded over; or thought and felt.' This prayer includes the lines: 'O Holy Spirit of God – come into my heart and fill me ... I offer to thee the one thing I really possess, my capacity of being filled by thee.... Fill me so that I may live the life of the Spirit; the life of truth and goodness, the life of beautyand guide me today in all things.'








Parish Council Report

The Parish Council met on Tuesday 9th May with 7 Parish Councillors and several members of the public being present. Apologies were received from Sally Povolotsky, Oxfordshire County Council (OCC) Councillor and Vale of White Horse District Council (VWHDC).

The meeting was the first of the new Parish Council for the next 4 years. The Parish Council currently has 8 Councillor's, and we are looking to co-opt a further 1 to bring the compliment up to 9 Parish Councillors. Please contact any parish councillor or the clerk to express an interest.

Following a Freedom of Information request from Nextwork Rail for information on level crossing "down-times at Stocks Lane and the Causeway we have received data for March 2022 and 2023 for comparisons. We are currently looking at the data and will be forwarding the information to the County and District Councils together with the Emergency Services. The data will allow for the Emergency services to adjust their procedures for attending incidents south of the Railway crossings. In this respect on the 2nd March this year the barriers were down between 12..00 and 13.00 for 50% of the time, between 13.00 and 14.00 they were down for 77.5% of the time!!!

Oxfordshire County Council have now granted a 20mph speed limit through Steventon. We look forward to its introduction.

The dangerous Ash trees in the Copse have now been felled. New trees will be planted. The spaces in the vicinity of the trees in conjunction with discussions between the Parish Council, the school (Forest Club) and the arborist who carried out the work will allow for a thriving nature habitat.

The next Parish Council meeting is on Tuesday June 6th, 2023, at 7pm in the Village Hall.



GARD UPDATE

GARD's Annual General Meeting took place on Tuesday 2nd May in Steventon Village Hall. There were forty-three people present (including the committee and two District Councillors), from seven villages, South Abingdon and Wantage.

Where are we now with the proposals and responses? There will be news in June. We await the responses of WRSE and Thames Water to our opposition (Thames Water by 13th June). Responses to RAPID (Regulator Alliance for Progressing of Infrastructure Development), the third leg of 'triple bill' of responses, are now in (11th May). RAPID produced its draft decision on the Strategic Water Sources (eg Abingdon Reservoir and Severn Thames Transfer) on 30th March. Responses have been sent from Stakeholders (i.e. GARD, OCC, the Vale, Parish Councils, Wantage and Grove Campaign Group). So far, we see that RAPID wishes both the Reservoir and the competing Severn Thames Transfer to move on to the next stage of evaluation. GARD does not agree with this position on the Reservoir. GARD believes that the Reservoir should not be allowed to proceed for further evaluation UNTIL a proper public assessment of the Reservoir's safety and flood risk potential has been carried out and published. We oppose wastage of further public money on the Reservoir in these Ofwat/RAPID studies (your water bills are paying). We are canvassing support from our MP on this. RAPID's response will be issued on 28th June. If they do not listen to our concerns, we will seek a meeting with them, local MPs and County Council. Our response to RAPID and to Thames Water are on our website. Keep an eye on our Facebook and Twitter for more information.

GARD is considering the next moves and needs to build a fighting fund. We will possibly have to consider a legal challenge. We shall continue to work on publicity and increasing opposition support, perhaps via a petition. We ask you to continue lobbying your MP and Councillors, and we would urge all members and supporters to consider a contribution to our campaign fund (donations will be matched by our major and organisational donors). The proposed Reservoir has no justification and, as Oxfordshire County Council stated in its January 2023 Press Release, it is "a destructive scheme, both environmentally and in its impacts on local people".

Walking Through Time: The Evolution of Steventon Parish

Owen Sutcliffe, Steventon Historical Society

I am firm believer that every walk should have a purpose and a pint at its end! Steventon Historical Society achieved both goals during two informal walks in winter 2023. The purpose of the walks was to share with the society an appreciation for the organisation of the landscape and how this provides context for the historical and archaeological evolution of the parish. It is impossible to provide a complete review but a brief summary is provided below. In essence, the walks attempted to integrate data from:

- · Observations of the landscape
- Age-determinations of ancient pottery (see images below)
- · Drone photography
- Remote sensing data (google maps and LiDaR data)
- · Information from the Heritage Gateway and
- Written documents that translate (from Anglo-Saxon) the description of parish boundaries. What is clear from these data is that we can now start to challenge conventional historical wisdom.

What is now apparent to the Society is that the area around Steventon has been occupied almost continuously since the Iron Age and was likely to have been a place of strategic importance.





Indeed it can be inferred that this location sat at the interface between rival communities trading between the chalk lands to the South and the those occupying the Thames Valley to the North and East. However, whilst the occupation was continuous, the distribution of settlements changed and only really nucleated into its present form in Medieval times. In addition to Iron Age settlements, Roman occupation is noted that also occurs beyond the current boundaries of the village. By Anglo-Saxon times, the parish boundaries had consolidated being defined at obvious geographical features (such as streams) or more subtle topographic features (that are still evident today). Once nucleation occurred, so the development of extensive open Medieval field systems progressed. These systems are now in various states of preservation but are evident as corrugated systems of ridges and furrows that can easily be observed in LiDaR imagery (see below). In summary, it is clear that Steventon Historical Society are expanding our understanding of the Parish beyond what has been widely published today. As we move forward we will attempt to
