Parish Council Report

The Parish Council met on Tuesday 4th July with 8 Parish Councillors, Sally Povolotsky, Oxfordshire County Council (OCC) Councillor and Vale of White Horse District Council (VWHDC) and several members of the public being present.

Parking by commercial vehicles in Stonebridge Road was raised as a problem for residents and passing traffic. Any instances of obstruction should be reported on 101 or the OCC website https://www.oxfordshire.gov.uk/residents/road s-and-transport/parking/illegal-parking with a photograph if possible. The Parish Council have written to the operators and would do so again

Two applications had been received for cooption to the Parish Council, with two further enquiries. Interviews would be arranged in the near future.

Further to the July report the recent road surface trials on Hanney road were the first in the country where all the different technologies were brought together in one location to complete an in-depth controlled trial. The aim of the trials is to independently verify the supply chain claims around their products in order to give a contemporary view, comparing them for value for money, durability and suitability for use across various highway defect types and locations. The surfaces will now be monitored over a prolonged time period.

The Vale of White Horse District Council have refused planning permission for 2, 2A, 6 and 6A High Street (formally Mira Spice, Munchies, Rainbow Colour and the "old paint shop").

The refused application included:13 residential units comprising of-7 one-bedroom apartments and 6 two bedroom apartments with provision for 13 parking spaces;

- 2 commercial units with 4 car parking spaces;
- · No disabled parking spaces;

 Two turntables, one to turn round delivery vehicles to allow a one way in/out route and one to assist in on site residential parking.

The main reasons for refusal were:

- Overdevelopment of the site in terms of the number of flats leading to cramped conditions for vehicle movements, hence 2 turntables, and parking. In addition, no provision was made for disabled parking;
- Restricted access to the site which, together with insufficient on-site parking would lead to a detrimental impact on both residents and highway safety.

The proposal also failed to provide adequate affordable housing provision at 20%, suitable provision of street naming and numbering, adequate waste management, waste collection and recycling.

There is no Parish Council meeting in August. The next Parish Council meeting is on **Tuesday September 5**th, **2023**, **at 7pm** in the Village Hall.



At tonight's Planning Committee (7th July)...I spoke on behalf of the residents as requested regarding:-

2A, 2, 6 and 6A High Street Steventon Abingdon OX13 6R

Rejected unanimously by the planning committee on the grounds of road safety, parking spaces and overspill, and over development!

This development amendment incorporates P21/V0140/FUL which was granted on 30th July 2021 which had 10 parking spaces for 7 flats and two commercial units with 3 parking spaces. The current proposal increased the flats to 13, considerably increased the area to be developed and found 3 parking spaces. Well done to the Parish Council and local residents for all their objections.

David Johnstone MP for Wantage and Didcot

Access to childcare is something that is regularly raised with me on the doorstep, and I launched a Childcare Survey last month to give parents and guardians across the constituency the chance to tell me about their experiences. Thank you to everyone who took part.

I will be sharing the findings with Ministers at the Department for Education, but the headline results included 95% of people saying we need more childcare infrastructure (much like most other infrastructure!) and 95% of people supporting the Government's plan to expand free childcare to 30 hours every week for children from 9 months old until they start school. This is the largest ever investment in childcare and will hopefully make a huge difference to the 75% who said that cost has been an issue in accessing childcare.

This month I was pleased to host my third annual Wantage and Didcot Climate Summit featuring a keynote speech by Grant Shapps, the Secretary of State for Energy Security and Net Zero, who took questions on everything from renewables to transport. We also welcomed local and national experts including Mike Blanch from the Westmill Sustainable Energy Trust, Jack Richardson from Onward and Professor Adrian Bull from The University of Manchester to talk and take questions about wind, hydrogen and nuclear energy. This was followed by the chance to question Thames Water's Director of Sustainability on water quality and tackling storm overflows. It was a very interesting event, and you can watch the recording on my website.

I also hosted a Crime Summit with Thames Valley Police in Wallingford this month after a local resident wrote to me with concerns about crime. It was a productive discussion about lots of issues and there were several things that TVP committed to go away and look at – including the time it takes to report an incident of anti-social behaviour online.

In addition, I hosted a Farmers' Forum for local farmers with the Farming Minister, Mark Spencer. We had a wide-ranging discussion about food production, farming incentives, the challenges for beef/pig/dairy/arable farmers, the environment and much more.

It is always a pleasure to welcome constituents to Parliament, and it was great to meet with Sarah and a group of young people from SOFEA when they visited again for a tour. I helped organise this after a visit I made to them recently – they do great work for the local community.

As one of the patrons of Play2Give I try to get to as many of Andy Baker's events as I can and this month he was running a great football tournament in Wallingford, which raised over £4,000. Well done, Andy!

In other news, my campaign for the local AEAT Pensioners hit another milestone as Parliament's Public Accounts Committee finished their inquiry that I helped secure and made recommendations to Government. GARD is a local community group formed to campaign against Thames Water's proposals to build a reservoir south-west of Abingdon.

News from GARD

Everyone will have read about the Thames Water financial situation and the fact that the company is negotiating with the government about how to continue. Will it be new money from existing shareholders? Or new shareholders? Or the government? Over the coming weeks we shall see what happens. It is not clear what this means for the reservoir proposal.

RAPID: The RAPID Gate 2 report came out but as we expected there was no commitment to a particular direction (Reservoir or water transfer). It is disappointing to see that RAPID have not answered GARD's criticisms of the water companies cost or carbon footprint estimates, nor have they insisted on an early evaluation of Reservoir safety.

GARD has had an online meeting with RAPID and the Environment Agency to discuss these issues, with local Councillors being present and supportive; this is leading to several more meetings, including two with GARD and Ofwat/Environment Agency, and one between RAPID and the Councils. These meetings are scheduled for the coming weeks, and we will keep you updated.

WRMPs: as we reported in July, the Water Company and WRSE responses to stakeholders' and residents' criticisms have been delayed. These plans will not be made public until early September.



The staff and children have worked incredibly hard to catch the children up since COVID and all of that hard work has paid off. We are so proud that 80% of our children will leave St Michael's at the expected standard in Reading alone - almost 10% higher than the National figure!

We know that SATS are just a snapshot of what our children are capable of and they do not allow the artists, geographers, athletes, musicians and scientists to shine but with our new curriculum in place, these skills and attributes thrive in other ways.



A small group of members and friends visited The Rifles Museum, Salisbury in June (there being insufficient take-up amongst the public to hire a coach). An excellent tour of the museum was given by the staff with access to rooms and

displays not normally available to visitors. Highlights included anecdotal story telling concerning the past characters of the Royal Berkshire Regiment, and a viewing of the museum armoury: see photo below (all arms deactivated)

At our July meeting, members were given a fascinating presentation by Chris Brickwood on the History of the Cherry Tree public house, with additional anecdotes provided by Dick Bosley. Particular attention was given to the period that the pub was called The Railway House, a name which it held for much of its existence.

Forthcoming events include a walking tour of Oxford to explore the history of the original GWR track into the city and the Steventon -Oxford turnpike road. We will also be welcoming Dr Christopher Currie to talk to members about the medieval history of Steventon, Further into the future, Dick Bosley will be leading members on a tour of the historic public houses of Abingdon.

The Perseid meteor shower

The Perseid meteor shower is lighting up the sky over the next month in what is always a highlight of the calendar for stargazers. With about 100 shooting stars streaking through the sky every hour, it is one of the brightest and most active showers of the vear.

The shower is caused by Earth slamming into the debris left behind by comet 109P/Swift-Tuttle in July and August every year. It is called the Perseids because the meteors appear to originate from the constellation of Perseus.

The Royal Observatory said: "The average speed for a Perseid meteor is 36 miles per second. The air in front of the meteor is squashed and heated to thousands of degrees Celsius. The smaller meteors vaporise and leave behind a bright trail of light. Larger meteors can explode as fireballs."

The shower will be at its peak – meaning the most meteors should be visible - on the night of 12 August and before dawn on 13 August. As with most things in the night sky, the best time to see the Perseids is when the sky is darkest. At this time of year in the UK, that means between midnight and around 5.30am. However, the Royal Observatory adds: "The radiant of the Perseids is actually always above the horizon as seen from the UK, which means that observers in the UK should be able to see some meteors as soon as the Sun sets. "Therefore, it is worth looking up in the early evening." Meteors can appear in any part of the sky so the more sky you can see the better. You ideally want to be away from tall trees and buildings. Observers can look out for the shower wherever they are, but a clear sky with minimal light pollution offers the best

The Royal Observatory adds: "This could mean heading out to the countryside, a nearby park or even do something as simple as turning your back to street lamps if you are not able to go anywhere. Give your eyes at least 15 minutes to adjust to the dark so that you can catch more of the fainter meteors this does mean that you should not look at your phone."
