

#### **Parish Council Report**

The Parish Council met on Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> June with 7 Parish Councillors, Sally Povolotsky, Oxfordshire County Council (OCC) Councillor and Vale of White Horse District Council (VWHDC) and several members of the public being present.

The Parish Council welcomed John Rice as a co-opted Parish Councillor. There is still a vacancy for 1 further Parish Councillor. If you are interested please contact the Parish Clerk.

The Steventon speedwatch group has now been operating for 1 year. It is run by 14 volunteers who give up some 20 hours of their time on a weekly basis. During this time 397 vehicles have exceeded speed limits and been reported to the DVLA. Of those exceeding the speed limits some 11 were found not to have an MOT. The Parish Council thanks the speedwatch team for the invaluable work they are doing.

Sally Povolostky has had her suggestion for Hanney Road to be used as a trial for new road surfaces taken up. On the day, the Hanney Road, Steventon will be closed between 9:00 and 3:00 and will be divided up into sections and in each section we will have a different operational method of pothole repairs being demonstrated, the purpose of this is to get a direct comparison of the different methods available in the market.

South Oxfordshire and the Vale of White Horse District Council are inviting you to have your say on their <u>Draft Air Quality Action Plan 2023-27</u>.

Their action plan includes both area wide actions, which apply to the whole of both districts, as well as actions targeted at specific Air Quality Management Areas (AQMAs). Currently, there are six AQMAs in South and Vale: Abingdon, Botley, Marcham, Henley-on-Thames, Wallingford and Watlington.

The survey asks a few questions to find out your views on both area wide and targeted actions. The six-weeks consultation runs from






GARD is a local community group formed to campaign against Thames Water's proposals to build a reservoir south-west of Abingdon.

#### **News from GARD**

<u>Responses</u>: Water Resources SouthEast (WRSE), Thames Water, Affinity Water and Southern Water are all delaying their response to the submitted comments on their schemes from the end of June to the end of August. This means that we cannot know where we stand until early September at the earliest, but there is clearly something significant going on with the South-East companies. If we hear anything we will let Stakeholders and residents know.

<u>Reservoir planning</u>: there is some news about the proposed reservoir: Thames have filed a Planning Application to build a test model dam embankment on Cow Common (halfway along the Steventon-Hanney Road). GARD welcomes the trial build but is puzzled that it is rather small, only three metres high and not very long. Will this be useful?

<u>RAPID</u>: we are expecting RAPID to deliver its Gate 2 decisions at the end of June. We have been requesting a meeting with RAPID to urge on them the importance of early, independent evaluations of the Reservoir safety, flooding Impact and true costs. They have agreed to meet, but we do not yet have a date. It is possible that RAPID will delay its decisions as well, in line with the water companies.



#### It's time to use up your old non-barcoded stamps or swap them for new ones!

You have until **31 July** to use up your old non-bar-coded stamps. Regular stamps without a barcode will no longer be valid after then. You can either use up your non-barcoded stamps before this deadline or swap them for the new bar-coded ones.

The stamps that have changed are the ones like those pictured here They feature the profile of Her Late Majesty The Queen on a plain coloured background









If you can't use them by the

deadline you can go to www.royalmail.com/sending/barcoded-stamps

to get a form or you can pick up a 'Swap Out' form from the Post Office along with a freepost envelope – but the Post Office won't be able to actually swap your stamps for barcoded ones. Special Stamps with pictures on and Christmas Stamps (like those pictured below) without a barcode will continue to be valid and don't need to be swapped out.

#### **Steventon Cricket Club**

A lot of cricket to report this month! The women's team had some excellent pairs games in the league, getting a good win against Freeland thanks to an excellent team fielding/bowling performance (Ava Tanner 2-10, Violet Thomas 2-1) and some good runs from Emilia Harding, but coming out on the wrong side of a close game with Oxford CC, despite Rosh Embrey taking 2-7 and putting on nearly 40 runs with Emilia in the last pair. They now begin their 11-a-side campaign in Division 3 South, and will have home games on July 2nd, 9th & 16th, do come down to support! The women's softball also had a great game and a 12 run victory against our friends from Freeland women (see below)



The Senior Saturday sides experienced mixed fortunes this month. May 20th; the 1s hosted Cumnor 3, and posted an imposing 217-7 thanks to Kester Matthew (71), ably supported by David Tudor-Griffith (32) and a string of middle-order cameos.
