Hello Steventon

Well that was a whirlwind of a summer we had, all seasons in 3 months, with a nip of autumn already. We see and hear climate disasters happening all around us, nationally and internationally, and we have to push for more action, We can do something - https://climateactionoxfordshire.org.uk

Truck Festival seemed more organised than last year, although still some traffic woes around Featherbed and the A4130, I don't the weather helped. Any feedback is appreciated, just email me!

At the District Council we once again pushed back on a major planning development on Abingdon road and officers rejected the scheme (again!), as well as on the High Street building regeneration. The village has lost enough of its unique character, doesn't have enough surrounding services and in village facilities.

At the County Council I'm constantly questioning decisions and getting increasingly annoyed with a lack of action on rural problems, I'll keep challenging and asking why. Locally we have several schemes in progress like the Relief to Rowstock phase 1, which will run from Milton Interchange to just past Steventon Lights, this is the first in a run of schemes to speed up public transport and cycling / walking.

I'm now the public transport champion, for OCC, I want to work with bus and rail companies to ensure rural services are built on, and the offering is accessible and affordable.

The Speedwatch data around the road reduction to 20mph is showing good compliance with the speeds contrary to the jungle drums.

You'll have seen some roadworks being undertaken, I honestly spend far too much time reiterating and encouraging officers to visit the village / villages to see for themselves what we face! The pothole innovation day was chance to show officers some of our parking issues on Hanney Road and issues around parking enforcement. I'm pressing on that all I can currently.

Dear Friends

As Friday 29 September is St Michael's Day, we decided to use the following Sunday (1 Oct) to both celebrate the life of our church and to invite you to discuss how best we can continue to serve our community. We are custodians of probably the oldest building in the village and the only one which is Grade 1 listed. This presents both a restriction and an opportunity to ensure that the church building continues to show both its constancy and adaption in the way it functions as a church. We propose to start this discussion by inviting you to a short informal family service at 09:30 on Sunday 1 October to hear how law, justice, service and even underwear are linked to St Michael's! This service will be followed by refreshments and an open discussion about the life and work of your church.

Steventon Cricket Club

Both Saturday teams were rained off twice this month. July 29th - for the 2nd time this season, the 1s took leaders Bampton to the wire. After being put in on a tricky pitch we made 142 all out (Dave Webb 33, Ankit Shukla 37, Carl Heaven 39). In Bampton's reply we bowled tightly and at 96-3 we still felt in the game. And so it proved, as our bowlers led by Shukla (4-18), backed up by good catching and a fine stumping by Rich Chapman, reduced Bampton to 9 wickets down, needing 9 to win off 3 balls, us needing 1 wicket. It wasn't quite to be, but a thrilling draw! The 2nd team hosted Abingdon Vale 4s, and posted a competitive 158 thanks to Steve Hawkes' 79. A good effort by the bowlers (Rushi Shinde 3-25) got them 6 down but one good partnership saw them home. August 12th- The 2s put on a decent bowling performance to keep Hendred to 176 but weren't able to back it up with the bat. The 1s went to W.IIsley, against whom we've had some thrillers in recent times. Ilsley opted to bat and posted an imposing 235-9 (Shukla 3-39). After a rain break, the target was reduced by DLS to 185 from just 31 overs. Chapman (28) got us off to a positive start, but we lost quick wickets looking for runs in tricky conditions, and at 99-6, things looked bleak, and we were well behind the DLS "par" score when the rain arrived again. The IIsley players headed for the bar to celebrate, but we could see a break in the clouds and so could the umpires! Sure enough, we got back out there, the target now 54 more from 6 overs! Shukla (48*) and Joe Bennett (31*) decided to 'go big or go home' and did it in style, to steal a famous victory with 5 balls to spare!

The women scored a 90-run win at W.Ilsley on July 19th, (Violet Thomas 22, Sophi Butler 2-14); they produced a magnificent fielding performance in drizzly conditions at Crowthorne & Crown Wood CC on July 30th, taking 4 runouts to keep a strong team to just 108-8, before unfortunately the rain deprived us of our turn to bat. August 3rd, Sarah Jones (3-16) and Bobbi Cookson (3-16) starred as we kept Hendred to 98/8. At 66-3 we were cruising before a collapse to 76-7. Enter the calm heads of Charlotte Haydon & Hannah Willett to steer us home for a 2-wicket win. Sunday August 6th saw Dinton CC visit the green. Eve

Hamilton (2-9) got us off to a dream start with 2 wickets bowled from the first 2 balls, including their best batter, before Bobbi Cookson (3-15), Sarah Jones (2-8), and the other bowlers backed it up to dismiss them for just 56. However, they also had 2 exceptional fast bowlers, and apart from Emma Vidler's brave resistance, we struggled, to slip to a 17-run defeat in a lowscoring thriller. On August 13th, we played the return fixture at Dinton, and put on a more creditable showing against the same attack, batting all 25 overs to make 111 all out (Shaan Southam 31). In reply we bowled accurately but without luck, as they made it home with 3 overs to spare. The women's team continues to make great strides - by the time you read this, they will have completed their first game against international opposition(!) with the visit of the Italian Women's team to the green. Forza!

The juniors continue to put in good performances, most notably the U15 girls, bowling reigning champs Moreton out for just 93 (Bobbi Cookson 3-8), then almost chasing it thanks to Bella Mercer's 17. In the return match we posted 86 thanks to Lilidh Keymer's brave 20* and 13 from Sasha Taylor, before Moreton scraped to a 3wicket win (Lottie Hart 2-14). The U13 boys/mixed team put in an excellent showing against Faringdon, keeping them to 114 (Toby Haydon 2-14), before nearly chasing it thanks to Miles Cookson's 17 and Lilidh Keymer's 19*. The U11s played well at Eynsham, (William Binning 19, Wilf Snuggs 2-9). The U11 girls hosted a tournament on the green on Sunday 13th August (see picture); excellent cricket was played, and the future looks bright.






Parish Council Report

There was no Parish Council meeting in August.

Following interviews of the recent 3 Parish Councillor applications Laurie-Jane Cann has been co-opted onto the Parish Council.

The Outline planning application for up to 80 residential dwellings (including up to 35% affordable housing) and use as a residential care Home on land off Abingdon Road has been refused.

The main reasons for refusal were:

- It is an unallocated site beyond the built-up limits of Steventon extending into the open countryside in a manner which does not accord with the District Council's strategy for growth as set out in the Vale of White Horse Local Plans.
- The site is subject to flooding resulting from ground and/or surface water flooding. The proposal fails to adequately assess drainage implications of the proposed development, incorporate an appropriate drainage strategy and demonstrate that the development can be accommodated without resulting in increased flood risk elsewhere.

OCC in 2022 launched a 3-year 20mph programme with the purpose of: "promoting lower vehicle speeds, encouraging more walking and cycling, and supporting a sense of a community place". The expected outcomes of the programme are:

- Improved experience for those using Oxfordshire's streets.
- Promotion of active travel and subsequent improved public health

- Reduction in road noise
- Improvement in air quality through reduced 'bunching' of vehicles
- More relaxed public spaces
- Reduced road casualty rate and improved road safety

Steventon, as you are aware, is one of the many 207 Parishes in Oxfordshire who are participating in this programme.

Since its introduction in June this year the average speed on the High Street (both ways) is 21.7mph.

The next Parish Council meeting is on Tuesday September 5th, 2023, at 7pm in the Village Hall.



Otto Baxter

Otto Baxter is a 36 year old man with Down's syndrome - he has recently written and directed his first film, an autobiographical thirty minute short called "The Puppet Asylum" starring Paul Kaye, Myanna Buring, Dexter Fletcher and Adeel Akhtar. In this ambitious allegorical musical horror comedy Otto explores how he feels about being given up by his birth parents, his fear of institutions, concerns about his own future, and his own quest for agency and power. Otto is the subject of upcoming Sky feature documentary 'Otto Baxter: Not a F**king Horror Story' charting a year of change as he makes his first film and he & his family tries to plan for the future. The film and documentary are due to screen on Sky & NOW TV on 24th September. They have already screened, and been a big hit, at Sheffield Documentary Festival; FrightFest, London; Ultimate Picture Palace, Oxford; Leicester Sq. London; Curzon, Soho: Garden Cinema, Covent Garden, BAFTA and other regional cinemas.

Otto is no stranger to the screen, having acted in several films, including the BAFTA nominated 'Samuel 613', 'Lola', 'Happiest Day' & 'Ups & Downs'. He was nominated for Best Actor at the Van d'Or independent film awards 2014, for 'Ups & Downs' and Winner, Best Actor at Cannes 'Festival Entr'2 Marches' 2014 also for 'Ups & Downs'.

Otto is a seasoned stage performer, most notably in a critically acclaimed turn in 'Waiting for Godot' at the Hackney Showroom in 2018. Some of you may know him from the local amdram performances in the village, where he had walk on parts. Otto was accepted as a member of BAFTA in 2022.

Since 2019 Otto has been a regular performer in Culture Device's drag troupe 'Drag Syndrome', as his alter ego Horrora Shebang and has toured all over the world performing with them.

Otto is an advocate for disability rights and has appeared in multiple TV documentaries growing up, with his brothers and adoptive mother.

Otto has three brothers, who also have Down's syndrome, two of whom are also artists in their own right. Titus, who goes by the name of William Percy, has made films which have been screened at Experimental film festivals and in Art Galleries in London. His youngest brother Rafi also appears in Otto's film as himself and has been in other short films. Under the creative mentorship of The Royal Ballet, as part of Culture Device, an innovative dance theatre for artists with Down's Syndrome. Otto and Rafi completed a residency at the Royal Opera House with a powerful reinterpretation of Stravinsky's 'The Rite of Spring', Rafi is also a Drag Queen. James, the eldest brother does not crave the limelight in the same way. His passions are Music, historical dramas especially Dickens and Thackeray, Looney Tunes, & Disney and horse-riding.
