2nd Pete Beecham at 40lbs


The Heaviest Pumpkin with winners being 1st Doug Bolton at 85lbs

Vandalism in Drayton and Steventon

We received a long letter from a Drayton Parish Councillor about some very disturbing vandalism that occurred in Drayton and spilled over into Steventon on 8 Oct. Here are some extracts

"..... signs that were erected in Steventon and Drayton advertising the Antique Fair, were either ripped to pieces, or simply removed altogether......."

".....three planks that someone took the trouble to paint black so that they wouldn't be seen, and each studded with at least thirty three inch nails, were laid on the ground leading into the hall car park just where the speed bump is, so that an unsuspecting motorist would drive over them and ruin their tyres. Fortunately, the first dealer to arrive, noticed them before driving over them, and removed them so that nobody would fall into the trap maliciously set to endanger property. This is when the police were called,more nails were scattered around the cars of the dealers, to cause further damage.....the perpetrators were spotted, but nobody associated them with the acts of vandalism at the time."

A Safe Speed Through The Village

If I'm honest I do feel frustration at having to slow down through the village; I want to get from A to B as quickly as possible and being required to drive at 20mph just adds to my frustration and impatience. Life doesn't have to be an endless charge of getting through life simply to arrive exhausted at our destination. Ultimately, the endpoint of our life's journey is shaped by the way in which we travel. Imagine the difference to those who we meet today, if you arrive un-hurried, with loving attention. 'Love has its speed,' wrote the theologian Kosuke Koyama, who notes that 'Jesus himself was pedestrian; he showed that the love of God moves at a walking pace, so as not to outpace anyone'. Our 20mph speed restriction may add on average 1 minute to my travel time, but what a precious moment that could be if I pause to consider the patient, peaceful, listening love of God and the benefit of travelling and arriving with due care and attention for self and others.

Taking time to reflect, remember and pray is an instinctive part of human nature, especially during Remembrance tide and Advent. This season starts with our annual service to remember villagers, friends and family who have died and whose memory we treasure. The service is at 6.00p.m. on Sunday 5 November and will be followed by light refreshments. Please add the names you wish to be read out and displayed on the form at the back of church or contact me directly. An act of remembrance will be held at the War Memorial on Armistice Day (Saturday 11th Nov.) at 11:00am; our service at 09:30 on Remembrance Sunday (12 Nov.) will be dedicated to those who served in theatres of war that we might live in peace and safety. Following this service an act of remembrance will be held at 11:00 as our king leads the nation in the National Service of Remembrance at the Cenotaph.

May the memory of the lives who have loved and protected us inspire in us the resolve to seek you kingdom and to do your will for the world of today.






Steventon HISTORY

The activities of Steventon History Society continue to evolve and attendance at our monthly meetings increase.

At our September meeting, we were honoured to receive a presentation by Dr Christopher Currie, an academic historian who has published several papers on the history of our village. His main area of interest is the evolution of Steventon in the period from the Norman Conquest to the coming of the Tudors.

Among many fascinating topics covered, the origins of The Causeway featured prominently. Dr Currie favours a construction date of the mid 12th century and proposed that The Causeway cut across the already existing Green. He sees it as an early form of 'town planning'. As you can imagine, much lively debate followed! The October meeting saw the first of a two-part talk (to be concluded in November) by one of our members, Steve Lucas. The theme is 'Stagecoaches, Turnpikes and Trains' and is giving an engrossing insight into the hectic few years after the arrival of the GWR in the village. Steventon station was, for a short period of time, the staging post for train travellers wishing to reach Oxford. A couple of statistics from 1842 illustrate the point: in that year, Steventon station dealt with 18,000 passengers and 13,000 tons of freight. The following is from the Historic England account The pub is named after the star in the sky, but the pub sign was apparently changed by the licensee Jack Cox to represent Stephenson's Great Western Railway locomotive which ran on the railway line roughly 200 metres to the south.

Parish Council Report

The Parish Council met on Tuesday 3rd October with 8 Parish Councillors, Sally Povolotsky, Oxfordshire County Council (OCC) Councillor and Vale of White Horse District Council (VWHDC) and several members of the public being present.

Sally gave an update on the Railway Bridge:

"The bridge strengthening proposals have been further developed, but not finalised, particularly in relation to what finished road layout can be accommodated above, i.e. it might be possible to accommodate two narrow traffic lanes rather than making the priority system permanent. There are aspirations to improve cyclist provision across the bridge, which may only be able to be achieved with a priority system. There are some concerns with the current temporary priority system and consideration is being given to reversing the priority, such that traffic moving up hill has priority.

A series of rail possessions will be required to carry out the strengthening work from below the bridge, possibly 24 in total, all on a Saturday night -early Sunday morning. Network Rail have indicated that they have some longer duration possessions planned, but it is unclear whether we will be able to make use of these, as these may require engineering train movements, which would then block our access to the soffit of the bridge.

The earliest start now is likely to be April 2024, subject to rail possession availability, for which Network Rail have not yet provided a full response and are continuing to be chased for this. It currently appears that the works duration will be about half a year. The cost of the works is likely to be in the region of £100,000 for above bridge works, £280,000 for below bridge works with approx., £120,000 Network Rail possession costs, i.e. £0.5m in total.

Bat surveys carried out so far indicate that none are present, such that this ecological issue is considered less likely to impact the timing of the works. A possession is arranged for October 28th/29th to gather information required for the detailed design".

Steventon Neighbourhood Plan has now formally been submitted to the VWHDC for assessment. The VWHDC will consult on the draft plan for a minimum six weeks. All comments will be collated and passed to the Independent Examiner for consideration as part of the examination process. The examiner will consider if the plan meets the basic conditions and recommend modifications where necessary. Following this, the District Council will consider the examiner's recommendations and determine if the plan should proceed to a referendum. If the plan is endorsed by a simple majority of those who vote at the referendum, the plan will become part of the Statutory Development Plan. The policies developed in the Neighbourhood Plan have to be relevant to planning, and therefore can only relate to the development and use of land. The next Parish Council meeting is on



GARD is a local community group formed to campaign against Thames Water's

We still don't know what the government will say to Thames Water, so please continue to write to your MP (details below) asking them to campaign for their constituents about the proposed reservoir.

The decision from the Secretary of State for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (currently Therese Coffey) will come after more deliberations by Ofwat and the Environment Agency. **Our information is that this will be after 20**th **November,** so until then it is still possible for our MPs to have influence.

Meeting with the Environment Agency and RAPID: David Johnston helped to arrange a meeting for GARD with the EA and RAPID on 13th October. We discussed GARD's view that the Reservoir would not be as resilient to drought as the Severn-Thames Water Transfer; also, the fact that the reservoir water would be undrinkable in severe drought, contaminated by algal blooms because the emergency reserve planned by Thames Water is too shallow. The EA are going to look further at the issue. We made a strong representation that Thames Water had not answered our criticisms on this (and many other points) in their Statement of Response.

Thames Water's Statement of Response: do you feel that Thames Water have answered the points you made in your consultation response? As far as GARD can see in looking at TW's "Statement of Response", they did not actually answer any criticisms properly. To get your point across before 20th November, you can write to the Environment Agency and/or Ofwat and complain about TW's attitude. Here are the contact details (copy to your MP):
