

#### Dear Friends

Greetings for February - a significant month this year, for enabling us to keep our lives on track.

It takes the earth slightly more than 365 days to orbit the sun; scientists calculate it to be 365.242190 days. If we didn't account for this extra time, the seasons would begin to drift. This would be annoying if not devastating, because over a period of about 700 years our summers, which we've come to expect in June in the northern hemisphere, would begin to occur in December! #### **Steventon Flood Group**

The Flooding in Steventon and surrounds post Storm Henk was at levels not seen for a long time.

Firstly thoughts go to all those who have experienced flooding, secondly on Sunday 7th January Cllr Sally organised an initial flood meeting which was very well attended at the Fox in Steventon (thank you Carly for accommodating us all).

The premise was to set up a Community Flood Action Group, and work has begun to get those going as soon as possible, with the main objective of the group being to reduce impact of further flooding by education, preparation and early response.

Sally has contacted the councils, Thames Water and the Environment Agencies for urgent meetings to look at future flood resilience and preparation as well as maintenance and repair of ditches, waterways, and drains. Since the main meeting, volunteers have met and started to prepare the flood plan and what each group will do. More volunteers always needed so please do email us.

Sally has secured £1800 to start with, as funds will be needed for insurance, equipment and training as well as further work needed to improve flood resilience. We hope the groups will now grow, we have an admin and coordination group, an ecology and environment group and a rapid responder's group.

The government has also released some high level information about a compensation scheme so please get in touch for details and links. Don't forget to come play the flooding toolkit on the link below to indicate if you have been flooded, in the home or garden / shed / garage, as this will help prompt further resources and support for the group.

Our recent Annual General Meeting marking the second anniversary of the Society included a review of our activities of last year and looked forward to the many events we have planned for 2024. Highlights of 2023 included an exhibition to mark the coronation of Charles III and a public talk on Steventon Railways. We also had some fascinating talks to the Society at our monthly evening meetings with varied topics such as the evolution of the medieval village; a history of the Cherry Tree Public House; and the Stagecoach, Turnpike and Railway era of 19th century Steventon.

Outings included guided walks around Steventon and The Hendreds to study the landscape archaeology of the area; the Folly Bridge neighbourhood of Oxford to learn about the coming of the railway to the city; and to the Rifles Museum in Salisbury. We have also been consulted by a number of statutory bodies about various aspects of Steventon's past. Finally, a recent piece in the Steventon News about Harriet Jacobs, the 19th century escapee slave from America who lived in Steventon for a while, was taken up by the BBC both as a radio interview and on their national website.

Many of our talks and walks are led by Society members and we are all grateful to them for sharing their fascinating research.

Looking forward to 2024

We have a similar range of activities planned for 2024, details of which will appear on our website, social media and in the Steventon News. One which we feel will have a wide interest is an exhibition of the history of the public houses of Steventon. We hope this might include a trail around the village leading people to discover the unexpected history of some of our dwellings. 

#### **Parish Council Report**

The Parish Council met on Tuesday 2nd January with 9 Parish Councillors Sally Povolotsky, Oxfordshire County Council (OCC) Councillor and Vale of White Horse District Council (VWHDC) and one member of the public being present.

Flooding within the Parish has been a major concern for everybody.

Community spirit and people's kindness and generosity have shone through and the Parish Council thanks everybody for their efforts and looking after vulnerable residents.

There has however been a minority that regardless of the conditions have no respect or concerns to fellow residents. Prior to the flooding "fly-tipping" into the Ginge Brook and ditches, ranging from car bumpers to willow tree, hedge and grass cuttings. The effect of such behaviour leads to blocking of culverts and ditches and reduces the flow of water. The ditch network throughout the Parish is there for the sole purpose of allowing free movement of water at all times. Please take these seriously.

Drivers who drove through flooded streets at speed causing bow waves that impacted on people's houses would appear to have no regard to anybody apart from themselves.

At a meeting in the Fox arranged by Sally Povolotsky a Steventon Flood Group was set up. Such a group had already been established in Hanney with the result that they had permissions in place to action "emergency road closures" something that took far too long in the village.

The flood group are looking for volunteers for 3 groups:

- 1 Physical work. Help in distributing sandbags, putting up road closure signage and helping vulnerable residents.
- 2 Co-ordination team. Help all year round with administration and co-ordinating training.
- 3. Ecology team. Working with landowners, the Environment Agency and Oxfordshire County Council.

In all cases training will be given. If you would like to volunteer your time and services to the flood group then please contact: steventonpc@tiscali.co.uk.

The dog bin has been removed from the Village Hall car park by the Vale of White Horse District Council Waste Disposal unit. It had become rather rusty but, rather than being given the option to replace, it was removed. The Parish Council is looking into providing a replacement and arranging emptying.

It has come to light that Thames Water have been sending the following communication to people who were "lost" as part of the consultation process on their draft Water Management Plan.

"Following public consultation on our draft water resource management plan 2024 (dWRMP24), we published our statement of response and revised draft plan on 31st August 2023.

A review of our considerations of the 1700 representations received identified a very small number which had been missed in the August publication. Please see a link to the addendum document which includes your representation and our consideration.

Thank you for making a representation to our draft water resource management plan (dWRMP24). Our revised draft plan is currently under review by the Secretary of State for the environment."

This highlights that procedures used by Thames Water are inadequate and badly managed. How can Thames Water be trusted with such bad processes and procedures?

The next Parish Council meeting is on Tuesday February 6th, 2024, at 7pm in the Village Hall.

#### **GARD** calls for Public Inquiry

On 20th December, GARD issued a call to the Secretary of State for DEFRA, Steve Barclay, to call a Public Inquiry into Thames Water's proposal to go forward with its huge Reservoir between Steventon and East Hanney. In our letter to Mr Barclay, we cited that there are many unresolved issues and issues of significant public interest on which Thames Water and its partners have chosen to ignore public consultation and criticism. Thus, in our view there is the need for a public hearing, inquiry or examination in public. We await the Secretary of State's response.

#### Support for a Public Inquiry grows

Subsequently, our MP, David Johnston has also written to the Secretary of State, supporting our demand for a Public Inquiry. We are very grateful for Mr Johnston's support, and this shows the value of all the letters you have written to him on this matter. We have also heard that the countryside charity, CPRE, has written to Mr Barclay supporting the call for a Public Inquiry. At the time of writing (15th January) we know that there are other organisations and political parties considering adding their voices to these calls. We remind readers that both the County Council (on the 12th December) and the Vale of White Horse (on the 13th December) have already passed unanimous council motions re-affirming opposition to the Reservoir, asking for talks with the Secretary of State, and for the reservoir plans to be suspended until issues have been resolved.

Join us! Your support is needed, at this time, to show the breadth and depth of the opposition. New members are joining all the time, but being able to announce a strong increase in membership would make a good political point to our opponents.
